At the end of beautiful Romsdalsfjord lies the small town of Åndalsnes, idyllically located in the valley of Romsdal by the mouth of the river Rauma. Åndalsnes is home to some of the highest mountains in Norway and many scenic attractions. Enjoy the lively emerald green river Rauma, lush waterfalls, steep mountains and magnificent bridges.


Highlights

Highlights include the spectacular Trollstigen road, an exceptional driving experience up a series of narrow hairpin bends, providing a great view of the dramatic mountain peaks surrounding it.

Another well known attraction is Trollveggen, the highest vertical mountain in Northern Europe.

The Rauma Railway, built in 1924, is a must-see when visiting Åndalsnes. Lonely Planet named it "the most scenic train journey in Europe". Don't miss a ride on The Golden Train from Åndalsnes to Bjorli.

Experience the Romsdalen Gondola, a shortcut to the fantastic fjord and mountain views of Romsdalen. Located right above the town of Åndalsnes, surrounded by the famous Romsdal mountains, is Mount Nesaksla (708 m.a.s.l.). A state-of-the-art electric cable car takes you 1679 m from the fjord and up the mountainside.



TROLLSTIGEN

An exceptional driving experience along a route steeped in tradition, through scenery with deep fjords and lush valleys. The Trollstigen road leads up a series of narrow hairpin bends, providing a great view of the dramatic mountain peaks surrounding it. Once on top of the plateau, the restaurant and viewpoints show Norwegian architecture at its best, and the view from the top is a sight to behold. Stop for lunch and visit the Trolls who reside there. Trollstigen is one of the Norwegian Scenic Routes.

Tour description

The excursion goes by bus from the port through the deep valleys and up the steep and winding Trollstigen road. The excursion includes several photo stops on the way up Trollstigen, at Trollstigen viewpoint, as well as a lunch stop at Trollstigen Gjestegård (optional). This tour can also be arranged as a roundtrip with stops at Gudbrandsjuvet ravine and the old Stordal Rose Church.



THE GOLDEN TRAIN – A RAUMA RAILWAY ADVENTURE

The Golden Train takes you on a magical journey through beautiful Romsdalen. Moving along the Rauma Railway, voted "Europe's most scenic train journey" by Lonely Planet, this tourist train is not short of remarkable sights. Lean back in your seat and marvel at the gorgeous views, diverse landscapes and important landmarks – passing highlights such as the Trollveggen mountain range, the Kylling Bridge and Verma waterfall.

Listen to vivid storytelling and delve into the historical event of the gold rescue during World War II.

Tour description

Departing from the train station in Åndalsnes – a 50 meter walk from the pier, the train travels through Romsdalen's majestic landscapes, following the Rauma River and passing historic landmarks. The journey highlights the dramatic events from World War II, the origins of the Golden Train. A stop at Bjorli station allows passengers to disembark the train for a couple of minutes to experience nature's tranquil surroundings. The leisurely pace of the train allows the opportunity to capture photographs of the amazing scenery.

ROMSDALEN GONDOLA & EGGEN RESTAURANT

Located right above the town of Åndalsnes, surrounded by the majestic Romsdalen mountains you find mount Nesaksla 708 m.a.s.l. As Norway's longest cable car of its kind, The Romsdalen Gondola offers a shortcut to the fantastic fjord- and mountain views of Romsdalen. Norway's first gondola build on sustainable principles, with no access road and no visible infrastructure. The spectacular Eggen Restaurant serve meals made from local produce. Guests can explore the area along short, easy paths on the mountain top to the different view-points.

Tour description

A easy 100 m walk from the port to the cable car. The cable car takes 5 minutes from the fjord to the top of the mountain Nesaksla. Coffee, cake and lunch can be served at the top.

Romsdalseggen Experience Hike

Experience Norway's wild beauty, combining a breathtaking cable car ride, panoramic mountain views. Guests meet their guide outside the Romsdalsgondolen fjord station, a short 50-meter walk from the pier. They board the cable car for a scenic seven-minute ascent to Nesaksla. After the cable car ride, the hike follows well-marked trails to Høgaksla, a vantage point with stunning views of the dramatic Romsdalseggen ridge. Returning along the same route, guests descend to the town again, concluding an unforgettable experience.

Guided cable car ride & easy mountain hike

After the cable car ride, the guide takes you along an easy mountain hike following a winding gravel trail by foot. Pausing at stunning viewpoints for photos, and listen to stories about the region's history and geography.

Guided cable car ride & ice cream with a view

Follow the guide to Eggen Restaurant for a taste of the region's specialties: enjoy a cup of locally brewed coffee and a scoop of brown cheese ice cream, a unique Norwegian delicacy. After savouring these treats, there is free time to take in the stunning views. The adventure concludes with a scenic descent back to the town.

Guided cable car ride & snowshoe hike

From the top of Nesaksla, equipped with snowshoes and poles, you embark on a stunning 1-kilometer hike, pausing to take in breathtaking 360-degree winter views. The adventure ends at Eggen Restaurant with a warm drink before a final cable car descent.

Guided city walk

Discover Åndalsnes' rich history, mountaineering heritage and legendary trolls. Guests meet their guide at the pier, and the tour includes a visit to the unique "Togkapellet" (train chapel), historic landmarks, and the Norwegian Center of Mountaineering, where guests can watch the film "Trollfolk" (15 minutes) about mountain climbing and local troll legends. The tour ends with free time at the mountaineering museum before a short walk back to the pier.

Ziplline over spectacular waterwalls

A scenic 30-minute bus ride through Romsdalen Valley before arriving at "Villa Verma", where the guests receive a safety briefing and a mini zip line training session from expert guides. First stop at the Kylling bridge viewpoint – a spot made famous by Tom Cruise in Mission Impossible 7. Then two zip lines, one at 30 meters and one at 60 meters, reaching a cliffside basecamp for coffee and snacks. A spectacular 200-meter zip line at the end before a short hike back to the bus.

Guided bus tour to Trollveggen

Experience the impressive Troll Wall "Trollveggen" up close on this guided bus tour. From the city center of Åndalsnes to the base of the Troll Wall, Europe's tallest vertical mountain face with an impressive 1,000-meter drop. The guide will share stories of legendary trolls, daring climbing attempts, and the region's geography and history. At the Troll Wall Visitor Center, a 15-minute stop allows guests to admire and photograph the towering peaks before returning to Åndalsnes.



In earlier times, Norwegians sent their livestock up to the mountains during summer to take advantage of the pastures in areas that were uninhabitable during the colder months. Shepherds would live in a small cabin (seter) to be near the animals. In wonderful surroundings, the guests are invited to join the mountain farm life, taste local traditional food, pet the goats and enjoy the tranquility. Visitors can enter the cabins and see how people lived during the summer months in the mountains, up to present time where the cabins are mostly used during weekends and holidays.

Tour description

The excursion goes by bus to Bøstølen, a 30 min. drive from the cruise port. An easy, 200 meter long walk on a gravel path to the summer farm.



The farm shop and art gallery are open.

An easy 100 meter walk from the cruise pier to the Norwegian Mounaineering Museum. Guided tour for groups can be reserved in advance. Restaurant Tindestua available for coffee or lunch.



Stand up paddle board

A peaceful paddle adventure on the emerald green river Istra, surrounded by the Romsdal mountains. This activity suits most people. A short walk from the pier to Norsk Tindesenter, bus tranfer to the starting point.





Here you will also find Romsdal Museum, one of Norway's largest and most comprehensive folk museums. Don't miss out on a trip to the Atlantic Road, equally impressive both in sunny and stormy weather. Visit the marble caves or join a RIB boat tour to the salmon fish farms.

Molde is situated 1,5 hours drive from the port of Åndalsnes, including a short ferry boat ride. The travel time is included in the duration of the excursions.







Romsdal Museum

The Romsdal Museum displays buildings and interiors from the whole region. Located in peaceful surroundings, the open-air museum is one of the largest and most comprehensive folk museums in Norway. A charming group of children can perform traditional folk dances, wearing their national costumes. The main building showcases a collection of ancient artifacts, an archive of historic photographs, as well as temporary exhibitions. There is also a café, a museum shop and a "bunad" workshop where you can see the traditional garments being made.

The round trip from Molde to the Atlantic Road and back offers several great attractions, including Bergtatt marble caves and Bud fishing village.

Bergtatt Marble Caves
